The Psychology major requires 39 hours of Psychology coursework, a minor or 2nd major, the University General Education requirements, and demonstrated proficiency in a foreign language at the 1202 level. A minimum of 120 earned hours are required for the degree. Psychology course work in five areas is required, Research Methods/Critical Thinking Skills (12 Hours) plus Gen Ed Science, Knowledge Base (12 Hours), Application of Psychology (6 hours), Psychology Electives (6 hours), and a Capstone course (3 hours).

1101 General Psychology (**SP301 Biological & General**) A grade of C or better for PSYC 1101, 2101, 2103 & Statistics 1220, 1221, or 1222 (1222 preferred) STATS within 2 attempts is needed to continue in the major.
